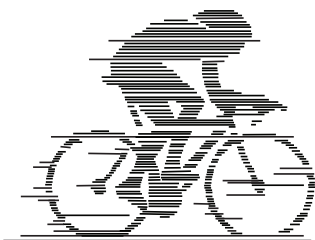

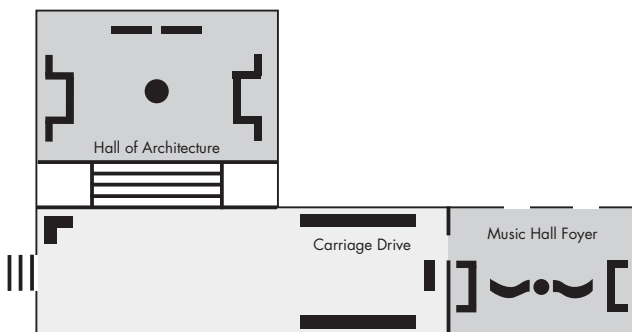

**If you have purchased more than one item, Carnegie Science Center staff will assist you in gathering your items.*

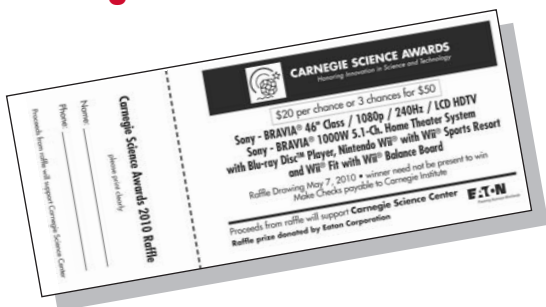
Auction Rules

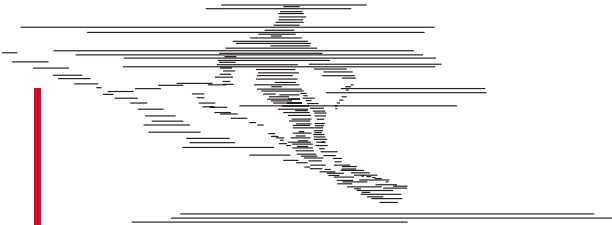
